The game mirrors the effects of the economy on businesses. During the game, the economy can change from 'steady' to a 'recession', 'depression' or 'inflation'. Businesses' share prices change based on the current economy just like in the real world. Jake, Logan and Zeke were attempting to buy out all the available shares in the game in order to maximize their investments. It made for a very competitive game!

Students are also currently participating in the ASXs 'Schools Sharemarket Game' where they are competing against students from across Australia. In the game, they can buy and sell shares and try to grow their portfolio of shares. They start with \$50,000 and hope to grow their portfolio instead of losing it. They need to watch how their shares are travelling each week and use decision making to act when share prices are falling.

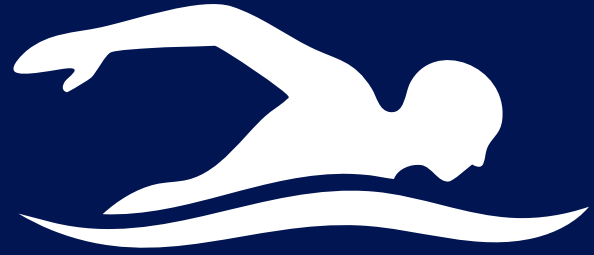

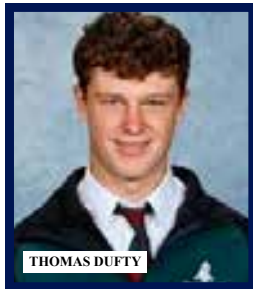

Daniel Hyatt and Thomas Dufty were also awarded Age Group Champion in their respective divisions, an outstanding result.

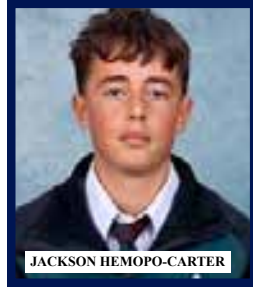

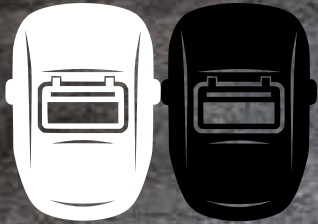
Workshop Vibes!
